

Campus Hazing Transparency 2024-2025 Report

Completed December 15, 2025

The Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) is a piece of legislation that became law in December 2024 that requires, among other things, institutions develop and distribute a Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR, or "Report") and report hazing statistics in the Annual Security Report as required by the Clery Act.

SUNY Fulton-Montgomery Community College Hazing Policy & Procedure

REPORTING PROCESS

FMCC encourages the reporting of incidents of hazing and takes each report seriously. It will investigate all reports diligently and thoroughly, in accordance with the FMCC Student Code of Conduct. Any person may report an incident of hazing in person, by mail, by telephone or electronic mail, using the contact information listed for Vice President for Student Affairs, or by utilizing FMCC's reporting system, FMCC Complaint Form.pdf

CAMPUS HAZING TRANSPARENCY REPORT

Per the SCHA, FMCC will compile and publish relevant and pertinent information¹ regarding each incident of hazing for which a recognized student organization was found responsible. This information will be collected and subsequently published (and updated) twice a year².
