

Facts and Data for:

**Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act
Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA)
American Rescue Plan (ARP)**

Under the CARES Act, CRRSAA, and ARP, Fulton-Montgomery Community College has received \$4,310,430 through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) for distribution to students. Detailed distribution data is contained in this document. The FMCC Certification and Agreement was returned to the Department of Education on April 9, 2020.

CARES Act (HEERF I) \$817,710 was received by the Institution. \$817,710 has been distributed to students and \$0 is still available.

Awarding process (05/28/2020 – 01/27/2021):

The goal of FMCC is to meet the emergency needs of each student who applies by the priority deadline of July 1, 2020. If additional funding remains, the committee will review all non-Pell applicants with special attention to those with the lowest EFC. If the initial student requests exceed the total funding available, the committee will divide the overage by the number of applicants and reduce each request by this equitable amount. If additional funding remains, the College will accept additional student applications for additional rounds of review until all funding has been exhausted.

Student eligibility:

- Be an enrolled student
- Be eligible for Federal Student Aid under Higher Education Act section 484
- Have submitted a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Be enrolled in at least one on-campus course as of March 13, 2020
- Submit a HEERF application to FMCC via google Doc application link emailed to students

CRRSAA (HEERF II) \$817,710 was received by the Institution. \$817,710 has been distributed to students.

Awarding process (01/28/21 – 05/11/21)

Priority for this funding is given to students who have exceptional need, such as students who received Pell Grants. However, students do not need to be only Pell recipients or students who are eligible for Pell Grants.

Awarding process (02/23/21 – 05/11/2021)

HEERF II Student Aid Funds will be paid directly to students without requiring an application. HEERF II funds will be awarded to students with exceptional need as demonstrated by the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from the 2020-2021 FAFSA. A methodology was developed to provide a Block Grant that correlates to each students' enrollment status (full-time or part-time) plus a standard supplemental amount based on the student's primary EFC.

Student eligibility:

- Be an enrolled student in the spring 2021 semester
- Have a valid EFC as determined by the 2020-2021 FAFSA
- Meet all income and/or household verification requirements as indicated in the student's Student Aid Report (SAR) or Institutional Student Information Report (ISIR)
- Meet all citizenship requirements for Title IV student aid

ARP (HEERF III) \$2,675,010 was received by the Institution. \$2,547,100 has been distributed to students and \$127,910 is still available.

Awarding process (08/30/21 to current):

American Rescue Plan (ARP) HEERF III Student Aid Funds will be distributed through two methodologies. Approximately 90% of the funds will be distributed through a Block Grant formula and approximately 10% will be distributed as discretionary funds through an application process. HEERF III Student Aid funds can be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus.

Block Grant formula: The State University of New York (SUNY) has required campuses to prioritize students with the lowest Expected Family Contribution (EFC), as determined by FAFSA, and has created a template which campuses must use to calculate the HEERF III Student Aid Block Grants. This methodology was developed to provide Block Grants to students with exceptional need. Based on this awarding methodology, students will receive a Block Grant that consists of two components: (1) a Base Grant dependent on the student's full-time or part-time status and (2) a standard supplemental amount based on the student's primary EFC. The EFC range will include EFCs between 0 and 14,615. Funding will be distributed in the fall 2021 and spring 2022 semesters.

Application process: All students, including those that received a block grant, are eligible to apply for HEERF III Student Aid funds through the application process. A student may request HEERF III funds for emergency costs that have arisen due to coronavirus. A student who did not receive a block grant may request funds through the application process. The maximum expense for each cost of attendance element is based on the College's federal Pell Grant cost of attendance. Applications will be reviewed on a bi-weekly basis beginning December 5, 2021. Students will be notified of the approvals or denials.

The fall 2021 block grant payments will be mailed to the students' home addresses the week of November 17, 2021 and the application for discretionary funds will open on the same date. The spring 2022 block grant payments will be mailed to the students' home addresses the week of March 14, 2022 and the application for discretionary funds will open on the same date.
